Analemma Society (AS) is a 501 (c) 3 Educational Non-Profit dedicated to teaching the public science through Astronomy. AS is registered with the Commonwealth of Virginia. We maintained our status by doing our annual registration with the state as well as filing income tax forms with the US Internal Revenue Service. We are authorized by the state of Virginia to fund raise. We operated Observatory Park at Turner Farm to further our educational aims.

AS opened Observatory Park (OP) to the public for Friday night viewing and OP Saturdays and Sundays in general as in years past and closed when the sky was cloudy, temperature below 20° F, (or wind/chill factor below 20° F), or snow/ice on ground, OP was not opened to the public.

The AS opens OP to the public on clear weekends for sundial viewing and general unsupervised public access to the park. During the year work was done on the Remote Access Telescope Observatory (RATO) by Fairfax County Park Authority (FCPA) on the structure to repair water damage and improvements to prevent future damage. This was completed in mid-November.

During summer months AS (Robert Anderson, Rich Mascis, and Jeff Kretsch) has set up an outreach table at the Reston Farmer's Market Saturday mornings to advertise the park.

Analemma Society Members (Alan Figgatt, Peter Gural, Bill Burton, Eve Kassalow, Calvin Powell, Robert Kellogg and Jeff Kretsch) were active in supporting the Fairfax County Parktakes program with courses on meteors, telescopes, the moon, and family centered courses among other topics. We also hosted visits to the park by the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency Alumni Association (NGAA) and other groups. There were 31 Parktakes sessions over the period of this report.

August 19-20, 2018 AS supported the North American Sundial Society (NASS) meeting in Pittsburg, PA.

April-August 2018 AS monitored new blue bird boxes at the Park and provided results to the Virginia Bluebird Society.

September 29, 2018 AS (Jeff Kretsch) with NOVAC (Ralph Marple) supported the Astronomy Merit Badge program for the Powhatten District Scouts Camporee held at Bealeton, VA.

Analemma Society had several events supporting seniors, one for Falcons Landing 29 August 2018 and one supporting the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI) on 28 September 2018.

Over January and February Analemma Society members supported various Science Fair judging activities at Langley and Herndon High Schools.

Membership Drive: Analemma Society collected \$1092 in dues and donations over this period.

Springvale Road Pickup: Springvale Road runs along the western boundary of the park, and to maintain a pleasant appearance and environment AS has been doing road pickup under the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) Adopt a Highway program. We have been doing the pickups on a quarterly basis and reporting results to VDOT.
